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## **SAFETY FIRST:**

## **IMPORTANT PRECAUTIONS**

At Kitchen and Bath Direct, we prioritize your safety and the longevity of your doors. Please follow these essential precautions:

- Avoid Mixing Cleaners: Combining cleaning products or chemicals can be hazardous and ineffective. Use one product at a time, and always follow the manufacturer's guidelines.
- ▶ **Use Protective Gear:** When handling commercial cleaners or solvents, wear safety goggles, gloves, and protective clothing. Ensure proper ventilation to avoid exposure to fumes.
- ► Handle Spills Immediately: Clean up any spills as soon as they occur to prevent damage to the door's surface.
- ➤ Stay Clear of Open Flames: Solvents and cleaning agents may be flammable. Keep them away from open flames, heat sources, or sparks.

## **CLEANING DOORS:**

## **BEST PRACTICES**

Maintaining the beauty and functionality of your doors requires consistent care. Follow these tips to keep them in top condition:

## **General Cleaning Guidelines**

- 1. Prepare a Gentle Cleaning Solution: Mix a teaspoon of mild dish soap with a gallon of lukewarm water.
- 2. Start from the Top: Use a soft sponge or cloth to clean the door surface from top to bottom, applying gentle pressure.
- 3. Rinse Thoroughly: Wipe the door with clean water to remove any soap residue. Avoid letting the solution pool or dry on the surface.
- 4. Dry Completely: Use a lint-free, absorbent cloth to dry the door. Ensure no moisture remains, especially near glass edges and corners.



### What to Avoid

- Power washing or using a garden hose. Excessive water pressure can damage seals and allow moisture into the door structure.
- Abrasive tools such as steel wool, razor blades, or scouring pads.
   These can scratch or chip surfaces.
- Harsh chemicals, including vinegar, citrus-based cleaners, and industrial-grade solvents. These may strip finishes or cause discoloration.
- Cleaning in extreme temperatures or direct sunlight can cause streaking or damage to the door surface.

## HARDWARE & MOVABLE PARTS:

## **INSPECTION AND CARE**

Properly maintaining the hardware ensures smooth operation and extends the life of your doors.

## **Hinges and Locksets**

- ► **Lubricate Regularly:** Apply a light oil, such as 3-In-One® oil, to hinges annually or whenever they squeak.
- ► **Tighten and Inspect:** Check screws and fasteners, tightening any that are loose. Replace damaged hardware promptly.
- Clean Locks: Use a graphite-based lubricant to maintain lock mechanisms. Tracks and Sliding Components
- Clean Tracks: Wipe tracks with a damp cloth and mild detergent, removing dirt and debris.
- Lubricate Bearings: Use clear petroleum jelly or similar lubricant on track wheels to reduce friction and protect against wear.



## **ANNUAL INSPECTIONS:**

### **KEEPING DOORS IN PRIME CONDITION**

To ensure your doors remain functional and attractive, inspect them regularly:

- Surface Condition: Look for cracks, warping, or peeling finishes.

  Repair and refinish surfaces as needed.
- Glass Components: Check for cracks, chips, or fogging between panes, which may indicate seal failure.
  - Structural Integrity: Inspect wood and fiberglass doors for splits or gaps. Address issues promptly to prevent further damage.

## DEALING WITH TOUGH STAINS AND LABELS

Even with regular care, stubborn stains and labels can pose a challenge. Here's how to handle them:

## **Removing Labels**

- 1. Gently peel the label from one corner. If it tears or leaves residue, moisten with soapy water.
- 2. Cover stubborn areas with a damp cloth for 10-15 minutes, then scrape gently with a plastic putty knife.

## **Tackling Stains**

- Use commercial glass or door cleaners for persistent marks.
- For oil or grease, apply a paste of baking soda and water. Rinse thoroughly and dry.
- For dried paint, soften latex paint with warm, soapy water and gently scrape with a plastic tool. For oil-based paint, consult a professional.



## PRECAUTIONS AGAINST COMMON DAMAGES

To maintain the protective finish of your doors, avoid the following substances and practices:

- Do Not Use: Paint removers, brick cleaners, abrasive sponges, or industrial-grade products.
- Protective Finishes: Clean gently with mild solutions to preserve coatings and finishes.
  - ► After-Market Additions: Avoid applying tints or films to glass components, as these may damage seals or cause cracks.

## SPECIAL TIPS FOR FOLDING AND SLIDING DOORS

If you have folding or sliding doors, additional care is needed:

- ► Track Maintenance: Clean visible track surfaces with a mild solution, then apply a small amount of lubricant evenly along the track.
- ► **Hinge Care:** Apply a thin film of WD40® to maintain the finish and smooth movement. Avoid getting the product on wood components.
- ► Flush Bolts: Spray a light lubricant into sliding pin mechanisms to ensure easy operation.



### **Attach Trim**

 For two-piece frames, slide the outer trim section into place. Using smaller finish nails, nail every 12-16 inches.

## **Final Adjustments**

• Replace the screws in the upper hinge with longer,  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " screws for added stability.

### Seal & Finish

- · Use a polyurethane sealant to fill all gaps in two-piece frames.
- Finish the door and frame with paint, stain, or varnish. Be sure to cover all surfaces, including the top and bottom edges of the door slab.

## Step 4: Install Hardware

- 1. Follow the lockset manufacturer's instructions to install the hardware.
- 2. Test the door for smooth operation, ensuring it opens and closes without resistance.

## SAFETY TIPS & BEST PRACTICES

- · Always wear protective gear, including gloves, safety goggles, and a dust mask.
- · Use caution when operating tools, and follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- · Doors should be installed by at least two people to prevent injury or damage.

## STORAGE & HANDLING

- · Allow doors to acclimate to the installation environment for 24 hours.
- · Store upright in a dry, ventilated space, away from direct sunlight or moisture.
- Avoid stacking horizontally or dragging across surfaces.
